First Lieutenant Joseph F. Myers entered the U.S. Army from Delaware and served with Company G, 401st Glider Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Battalion. He was reported missing on September 30, 1944, during the fierce offensive to capture the lands between Kiekberg Woods and the Maas River, known as the Mook Plain, during Operation MARKET GARDEN. Specific information regarding his loss is unavailable. He could not be located after the battle, and attempts to recover his remains following the war were unsuccessful. Today, First Lieutenant Myers is memorialized on the Walls of the Missing at the Netherlands American Cemetery in Margraten.
